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General Information About This Pattern

It is very important that you print this pattern out WITHOUT SCALING or RESIZING.

These options are in the print dialog box (the window that pops up when you go to print).

**To confirm the pattern is printed correctly,
measure either the large grid (should 8x10 inches)
or the small grid (should be 4x4 cm).**


After you print, using either a fabric pen, a fine-tip permanent marker or even a ball-point pen,
trace the patterns onto gridded pattern tracing paper or just plain, non-fusible interfacing.

Most of these pieces for this pattern are simple rectangles. As such, I will provide dimensions only rather than PDFs for these pieces. You can either construct the pieces out of pattern paper or interfacing, or directly trace the size onto the fabric using a white chalk pencil or washable fabric marker.

Instructions for making the pattern pieces

1. Bag side and pocket. Using the pattern on top, extend the sides down to make a piece 23" long (by 5" wide). Including the tab, this piece should be 23.5" by 5". Cut one out of bag fabric.
2. Bag side and bottom. As above, using the pattern on top, extend the sides down to make a piece 31" long (by 5" wide). Including the tab, this piece should be 31.5" by 5". Cut one out of bag fabric.
3. Lining sides and bottom. Cut one rectangle, 5"x36", out of lining fabric. Alternatively, make a pattern 5"x18" and cut one on the fold. Also cut one 5"x36" and one 5"x18" out of batting or insulation.
4. Front and back fabric panels. Dimensions are 2.75"x15". Cut four out of fabric.
5. Front and back contrast panels. Dimensions are 4.5"x15". Cut two out of contrasting fabric.
6. Lining front and back. Dimensions are 8"x15". Cut two out of lining and three out of batting or insulation.
7. Facing. Dimensions are 2"x12". Cut two out of fabric.
8. Strap. Pattern is on the next page. Cut four out of fabric.
